## SD42 International Education Cultural Program Instructor

### Job description

Instructors prepare, deliver and assess outcomes based on a cultural program where students learn about Canada through the use of activities that will improve their oral English and their understanding of the English that they hear, and then apply their improved skills on excursions. Instructors must be able to adapt and tailor the lessons of the program to engage the students taking into account their abilities.

Programs vary in length: 1 week up to 4 weeks in length, from 10 hours per week to 35 depending on client requirements

Programs occur at various times of the year, depending on the client needs.

Instructors will:

- plan lessons to tie into and support student learning about the excursions on the schedule *ie learning about totem poles/aboriginal culture prior to seeing the totem poles in Stanley Park*
- may use International Education resources or create their own for lessons.
- assess and report on progress of students.
- prepare a final report (as determined by International Education) for each student.
- must be available to work at different locations, such as Riverside or an alternate SD42 site.
- may be asked to chaperone the students on excursions.
- must represent SD42 in a professional manner when chaperoning students must follow SD42 International Education chaperone guidelines on excursions
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### Qualifications

- Minimum requirement: TESOL or Teaching Certificate (TQS or equivalent)
- Proven experience instructing school-aged students (international experience an asset)
- Ability to instruct learners with various levels of English
- Flexibility to adapt lessons to different levels of English
- Knowledge of the use of technology (i-pads) to support program goals
- Basic first aid certificate if accompanying students on excursions
- Current Criminal Record check
